- Fill in the police's contact form, so they can contact you.

What? Where?	'Veilig Thuis', meaning 'safe at home', is there to help anyone, young and old, who is affected by domestic violence or child abuse. Veilig Thuis breaks the spiral of unsafe situations and offers perspective, giving people a future again. They have locations all over the Netherlands. The link is for the location in the Twente region.
For who?	Dutch people looking to report a case or ask for advice. Also available for any other questions regarding domestic violence. Non-Dutch speakers will need someone to act as translator as the staff only speaks Dutch.

What? Where?	Sexual Assault Centers, the CSG's, operate in 16 regions in the Netherlands. Their staff are working together with the police, healthcare professionals (including psychologists) and the government. For who?	Dutch and English speakers who wish to educate themselves on sexual violence and the options available to them. If you are a victim and contact this center, you will be provided with personal support from a range of professionals and a case manager.
